#### SYMOPSIS 1.

Twanty four 500 lb. 4/5 second delay fuze demo bombs were dropped and 15,000 x .50 caliber rounds of ammunition were expended in a bombing and strafing attack of MARUSHIMA NITROGEN PLANT (3212 deg. Horth 13025 deg. East). Direct hits were scored on two large buildings in the plant causing heavy explosions followed by large fires with flames reaching 300 feet. Pour to five small buildings and three tanks in the plant were completely destroyed. The run was made thru the center of the plant on a NW heading at minimum altitude. Smoke was up to 5000 feet after returning to the target area to search for survivors of a crashed A/P. At NAGA-SHIMA (3210 des. North 13013 deg. East) a radio station and buildings were strafed and damaged. Two A/P's were holed by A/A. Fighter cover was excellent.
